Last year, to reach that goal, the 440th C.I.'s began planning a twenty-event, 1.2 mile obstacle course that will encircle the perimeter of the Cambrai-Fritsch Kaserne ballfield.

In order to enhance the morale and confidence of the battalion soldiers Lt. Col. Earl Sakas, Eattalion Commander composed the idea to build the difficult endurance course.

Salas, a hard-charging Airborne Ranger, said, "The course will be a leadership tool, it's a way team leaders and everyone else through the chain of command can measure their soldiers." The West Point graduate added that when the course is completed it will be for the 440th and the entire military community.

The guts and stamina course was also designed as a deversion for the Physical Training Program now being utilized and for the companies to compete with each other in timed events.

Each of the four company's will work on the obstacles and use only durable and weatherproof material. The course should be completed by May 1982, Sakas said.

The soldiers will start off with

jumping jacks, then onto a quarter mile run. From there the 440th troopers will engage a series of challenges to test skill and strength. These obstacles are: Belly Busters, Verticle Wall, Horizontal Ladder, Swinger, Push-Ups, Low Crawl, Long Jump, Rope Climb, Stair Climb, Balance Beam, High Step, Sit-ups, Tires, Pull-ups, Slant Wall, Weight Lifts, and the last thing, which will also bring the soldier back to the start is the Farallel Bars.

Once completed the hard-core obstacle course should prove a great help in providing the 440th a tool for their goal, "TO BE THE EEST."
