This has been an exciting 15 months for the 22nd Signal Brigade, and if there are those of you who are past the stage where you can stand excitement, I truly feel sorry for you.

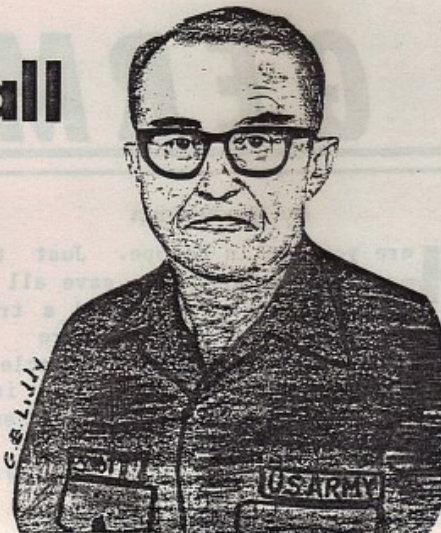
Looking back
