"Everything has improved"

## Top enlisted leader visits brigade

The Sergeant Major of Army forces in Europe, CSM Walter W. Krueger visited McNair Kaserne recently and met with key NCO's and soldiers.

"Everything has improved since the last time I was here," the 50-year-old soldier said. "This place use to be a dump, there was lousy leadership and the NCO's weren't doing anything. Soldiers looked bad and suffered for it."

Continuing, the top enlisted leader said, "Everything I've looked at today with the exception of a couple of non-commissioned officers, was a tremendous improvement. Krueger, who has been a sergeant major for 14 years, said when he met the two soldiers he considered substandard, he made a point to let them know it.

Commenting on sexual harrasment in Europe, Krueger said, "Yes we have it, and the NCO Corps needs to fix it. I guess the biggest thing we need to do is have it identified to us. The harassee needs to come forward to the NCO and point out the harrasser, and we'll fix the harrassers clock for him or her."
