Free checking - Sure Pay

The Community Bank (AMEXCO) wants it's customers to take advantage of free checking with Sure-Pay. Free checking is also offered with a \$300 allotment. However, some prefer to pay the unnecessary charges.

"For most of us, it's not easy to keep a minimum balance of \$300 in a checking account", said Mrs. Thelma Martin, Bank Manager of the Hoechst branch, "but with Sure-Pay or a \$300 allotment, the Community Bank will give you free checking even if the balance falls down to \$1." Hours at the McNair bank are 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. Monday thru Friday. The Darmstadt bank has the same hours, except they open thirty minutes later, at 9:30 a.m.
